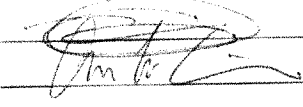

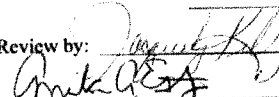
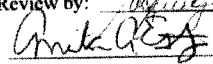

To: Mayor Devlin and Members of the Village Board,

Thank you for your continued support of the Mirror Lake Steward Program in 2025. We are pleased to share some preliminary data that highlights both the level of activity on the lake and the value of this program.

In 2025, as in 2024 and 2023, a steward was stationed at the Mirror Lake boat launch seven days a week for eight hours per day. This past season, 2,506 boats were inspected (an increase over both previous years) averaging roughly one inspection every 20 minutes, underscoring how heavily used the lake is. Of those boats, 582 were found to have vegetative organisms; fortunately, none were invasive. Boats originated from 80 different waterbodies, 46 of which are known to contain invasive species, including Lake Flower, Fish Creek Ponds, and the Saranac River—all in close proximity to Mirror Lake.

In addition to inspections, the steward engaged in conversations with 3,471 visitors, educating them about aquatic invasive species and reinforcing the “Clean, Drain, Dry” message. The steward also helped observe and monitor the accessible ramp, providing an added benefit to lake users.

Looking ahead to 2026, MLWA plans to contract with Paul Smith’s College to provide a steward at the public beach, continuing the same prevention and education program seven days a week, eight hours a day. The total cost of the program is \$35,903. We have successfully secured a \$20,689 grant from the Lake Champlain Basin Program, leaving a remaining balance of \$15,214.

We believe that protecting the health of Mirror Lake is a shared responsibility of the entire community. To that end, we are seeking support from our partners—the Town of North Elba, the Village of Lake Placid, and the Ironman Corporation—and are requesting that each partner contribute \$4,000 toward the remaining cost. We respectfully ask you to consider supporting this important protection effort.

It is the position of the Mirror Lake Watershed Association that the Steward Program is essential to keeping Mirror Lake free of invasive species and represents a significant community benefit. The lake’s economic, aesthetic, and recreational value contributes directly to the quality of life in Lake Placid, making this program a worthwhile priority.

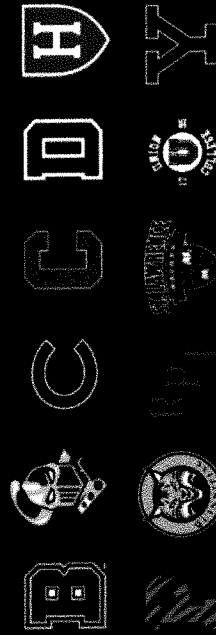

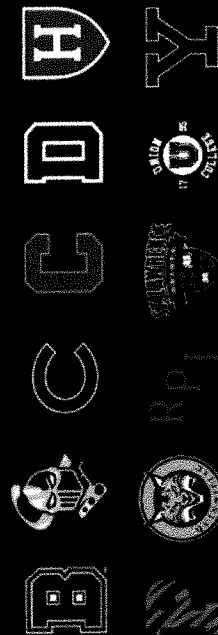

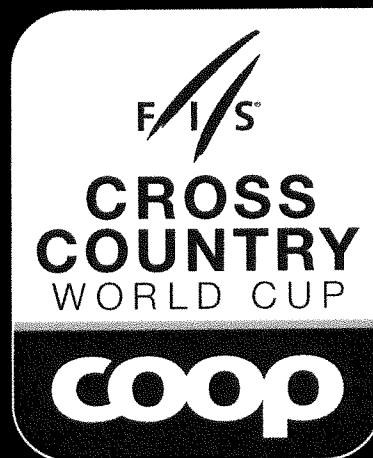
