**DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF THE NORTH COUNTRY
ENGINEERING TECHNICAL SERVICES AGREEMENT
FOR
MUNICIPAL EFFICIENCY STUDY**

WITH THE

VILLAGE OF TUPPER LAKE

This Agreement entered into this ____ day of _____ 20__, by and between:

VILLAGE OF TUPPER LAKE, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, having an office and principal place of business located at 53 Park Street, P.O. Box 1290, Tupper Lake, NY 12986, herein after referred to as the "Village",

And

DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF THE NORTH COUNTRY, a public benefit corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, having an office and principal place of business located at 317 Washington Street, Watertown, New York 13601, hereinafter referred to as the "Authority".

Recitals

1. The Village and Town of Tupper Lake have an existing shared services agreement to provide water services to Town and Village Customers.
2. The Authority has been retained by the Village to assist with multiple water and wastewater improvement projects since 2015.
3. The Village is desirous of having a municipal efficiency study completed to evaluate the feasibility and benefits of implementing other functional consolidations up to and including municipal dissolution the Village.
4. Given its longstanding role in assisting the Village with various infrastructure improvement projects and the Authority's prior experience with municipal efficiency and dissolution, the Village has requested the Authority provide technical assistance to review the Village and Town services and draft a dissolution study. Complete copies of prior studies can be found on the Authority's website at: <https://www.danc.org/municipal-studies>
5. At its board meeting held on _____, 20__, the Village Board selected the Authority to assist the Village to provide these services. A copy of this Resolution has been attached as Exhibit A.
6. This Agreement is authorized under Section 2704(17) of the Public Authorities Law.

Agreement

In consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

Scope of Services

1. The Authority will provide project management assistance services to proceed with the pursuit of a dissolution study. Services provided shall include:
 - a. Funding agency coordination and assistance, including submittal of a Local Government Citizens Re-Organization Empowerment Grant (CREG).
 - b. Completion of a Dissolution Study and Implementation Report meeting the requirements of the NYS Department of State. The Study will include the elements included in Exhibit B.
 - c. Planning, coordination and facilitation of a maximum of seven (7) stakeholder committee meetings.
 - d. Coordination with the Village's attorney to assist with legal aspects of the dissolution study.
 - e. Presentation at two public informational meetings.
 - f. Attendance at board meetings to discuss project updates.

Terms and Conditions

1. The Authority will conduct work under the sole direction of a single, primary point of contact of the Village.
2. The Village shall pay the Authority for such services at the labor hour burdened rate for the specific job classification performing the services as indicated in Table 1 below. The Authority reserves the right to update the hourly rates annually effective April 1, i.e. the beginning of the Authority's fiscal year. The Authority will provide an updated rate table at that time; noting however, the total cost of these services shall not exceed \$100,000. The Authority shall submit monthly invoices properly itemized and supported. The Village shall make payment thereof within 30 days of receipt of each invoice.

3. The Authority will complete the work specified herein 12 months after authorization to proceed; however, the Authority reserves the right to request an amendment for justifiable causes outside of the Authority's control requiring additional services. This schedule requires the Village and Town's cooperation in providing information requested in a timely manner and adherence to a monthly project meeting schedule.
4. The Village shall provide the reasonable support services of its attorney, clerk and other staff as appropriate to assist in implementing the project.
5. The Village shall carry general liability insurance in the customary amounts and coverages maintained on its general operations, and shall name the Authority as additional insured on the liability policy. The Authority shall carry general public liability insurance in the customary amounts and coverages maintained on its general operations, and shall name the Village as additional insured on the liability policy.
6. The Village will at all times indemnify and save harmless the Authority against all liabilities, judgments, costs, damages, expenses and attorney's fees for loss, damage or injury to persons or property resulting in any manner from the willful malfeasance, intentional or negligent acts or omissions, of the Village, its officers, agents or employees pertaining to the activities to be carried out pursuant to the obligations of this Agreement. The Authority will at all times indemnify and save harmless the Village against all liabilities, judgments, costs, damages, expenses and attorney's fees for loss, damage or injury to persons or property resulting in any manner from the willful malfeasance, or negligent acts or omissions, of the Authority, its agents or employees pertaining to the activities to be carried out pursuant to the obligations of this Agreement.
7. The Authority shall use reasonable diligence to provide the services herein required, but shall not be liable to the Village for damages, breach of contract, or otherwise, for failure, suspension, diminution, or other variations of service occasioned by any cause beyond the control of the Authority. The Village will not be liable in the event of a breach beyond their control. Such causes may include, but are not restricted to, acts of God or of the public enemy, acts of the government in its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, riots, strikes, civil disturbance, quarantine, restrictions, or inability to obtain equipment or supplies.

8. All accounts, reports and other records generated by the Authority or required under this Agreement, in the performance hereof, shall be open to inspection and audit at all reasonable times by the Village. Such records shall be retained by the Authority for a minimum of seven years following the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement or an extended Agreement.
9. The parties acknowledge that the Authority has undertaken and may undertake various projects unrelated to this Agreement. It is the intent of the parties that this Agreement, the service provided hereunder and all payments, accounts receivable and equipment resulting from or required by such service shall be separate from and independent of all unrelated projects and activities of the Authority. The Village shall have no right to, or claim upon, the assets, insurance proceeds or income of the Authority other than those associated with the performance of this Agreement, in satisfaction of any claim by the Village arising hereunder. A similar restrictive clause is contained and will be provided in all service agreements made by the Authority with others.
10. The Authority is an independent contractor with the Village and this Agreement does not create and shall not be construed as creating a relationship of principal and agent, landlord and tenant, or employer and employee.
11. No waiver by Village or Authority of any breach of any term, covenant or condition contained in this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of such term, covenant or condition itself, or of any subsequent breach thereof.
12. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. If any provision of this Agreement shall, to any extent, be held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall continue to be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
13. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and may be modified or amended only by the written mutual agreement of the parties.
14. All notices required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid to the addresses indicated above.
15. The Village and/or Authority may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon 30 days prior written notice provided however, that the Village shall pay the Authority all costs incurred by the Authority to the date of termination.

Exhibit B

Dissolution Study Elements

The Dissolution Study is intended to provide a foundation for the project. The study will include a comprehensive list of the Village's services, including information on a per-service basis which shall include budget allocation, employment allocation, per resident cost, inventory of equipment, complexities of delivery of services, specialized knowledge of personnel and necessary capital investments as well as the opportunity for cost savings and/or service enhancement. The study shall consider the general perception of the feasibility of possible options and the public's concerns and likely reactions to restructuring service delivery and potential impact on service quality. The study will contain at least the following elements:

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1. The name of the local government entities to be consolidated;
2. The territorial boundaries of the entities;
3. The type and/or class of the entities;
4. The entities' assets, including but not limited to real and personal property, and the fair value thereof in current money of the United States;
5. The entities' liabilities and indebtedness, bonded and otherwise, and the fair value thereof in current money of the United States;
6. Terms for the disposition of the entity's assets and the disposition of its liabilities and indebtedness, including the levy and collection of the necessary taxes and assessments refore;
7. Any plan for the transfer or elimination of public employees;
8. Any agreements entered into with the towns;
9. Whether any local laws, ordinances, rules or regulations of the entities shall remain in effect after the effective date of the consolidation or shall remain in effect for a period of time other than as provided by state law
10. The manner and means by which the residents of the entities will continue to be furnished municipal services following the entities consolidation;
11. A fiscal analysis of the effect of consolidation on the towns;
12. A fiscal estimate of the cost of consolidation;
13. Alternatives to consolidation;
14. Any other matters desirable or necessary to carry out the consolidation.

RESOLUTION

LOCAL GOVERNMENT CITIZENS RE-ORGANIZATION GRANT

WHEREAS, the Village of Tupper Lake (Village) is a small Adirondack Village in Franklin County, New York that has been faced with the declining populations, loss of commercial institutions, increasing poverty rates, and loss of financial resources over the last several decades, and

WHEREAS, the Village has become aware of the potential benefits that could accrue to residents by consolidating services with the Town of Tupper Lake (Town), and

WHEREAS, the Village would like to complete a study to quantify the potential benefits of consolidation and educate Village residents about the results of the study, and

WHEREAS, the Village would like to apply for a Local Government Citizens Re-Organization Empowerment Grant (CREG) in the amount of \$50,000 through the New York State Department of State to provide financial assistance with this study , and,

WHEREAS, the Village understands that they will be required to cover the 50% local-government share up to the maximum grant amount of \$50,000 and 100% of all project cost beyond the maximum grant if the project does not move forward to implementation, and 10% of the \$50,00 grant if the project does proceed to implementation, as required by the Grant.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it RESOLVED, that the Village does hereby request that the Development Authority of the North Country (DANC) provide a proposal to complete a study to quantify the potential benefits of consolidation and educate Village residents about the results of the study.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it RESOLVED, that the Village does hereby authorize Village Mayor, Mary Fontana, to execute all financial and /or administrative processes relating to the implementation of the program on behalf of the Village as lead applicant for a Local Government CREG grant application.

Agreement and Lease

Fire & Rescue Boat to the Tupper Lake Volunteer Fire Department

This Agreement and Lease is entered into this _____ day of _____, 2026 between the Upper Saranac Lake Association (USLA), the Tupper Lake Volunteer Fire Department (TLVFD) and the Village of Tupper Lake (Village).

Whereas, USLA will purchase one Fire & Rescue Boat (**Fire Boat**) in consultation with TLVFD, one related transport trailer (**Trailer**) and USLA already owns one aluminum 32-foot dock Fire Boat Dock (**Dock**); and

Whereas, Village formed and operates the TLVFD which provides firefighting, rescue and other public safety functions; and

Whereas, the Village and TLVFD provides fire protection to a portion of the Town of Santa Clara that is closest to Tupper Lake and Saranac Lake, including properties on Upper Saranac Lake, while Paul Smith's Fire Department provides protection to other portions of Santa Clara; and

Whereas, USLA will lease the Fire Boat, Trailer and Dock to the TLVFD as stipulated in item number one (1) below; and

Whereas, consistent with such arrangements, the TLVFD utilizes the Fire Boat for firefighting, rescue and other public safety purposes, as well as for training exercises on Upper Saranac Lake; and

Whereas, TLVFD and USLA wishes to dock the Fire Boat at the location centrally located on Upper Saranac Lake that has been used in previous years for this purpose. This property is located at 442 Gilpin Bay Road in the town of Santa Clara and owned by Eagle Island, Inc. and

Whereas, an annually renewable agreement between the TLVFD, the Village and Eagle Island, Inc. dated August 17, 2020 already exists for this seasonal use docking space and it is assumed this Agreement will continue throughout the time of this Lease; and

Whereas, the parties are desirous of entering into this Agreement and Lease to set forth and memorialize their understanding and agreement regarding TLVFD use of the Fire Boat, Trailer and Dock exclusively for Upper Saranac Lake.

Now Therefore, the parties agree to a Lease as follows:

1. **Lease Term:** As of the date of this Agreement and Lease, TLVFD agrees to lease the below-described Fire Boat, Trailer and Dock from USLA for \$1.00 per calendar year

starting the date of this agreement and ending on December 31, 2029. This agreement will end either on the date stated or the date the boat is deemed damaged beyond economically feasible repair, or the Fire Service Agreement between the Town of Santa Clara and TLVFD is terminated. This Lease can be renewed by mutual agreement if the Agreement between the Town of Santa Clara and TLVFD is renewed on January 1, 2030

2. **Insurance:** During the term of this Agreement and Lease, Village and TLVFD will provide and maintain at their expense and without expense to USLA, Commercial General Liability insurance, covering the Fire Boat, Trailer and Dock with a minimum \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000/aggregate coverage. Such insurance shall be written by an insurance company authorized to write insurance in New York State, shall be drawn on standard forms approved by the NY State Insurance Department and shall protect as listed "Additional Insureds", USLA and its agents, officers, directors, employees, volunteers and all contractors, consultants and subcontractors to the aforementioned parties. All insurance required to be maintained under this Lease must provide that the applicable coverage must not be cancelled without thirty (30) days' notice to the Insureds, including USLA and Eagle Island, Inc. Village and TLVFD shall provide USLA with a copy of the endorsement with the required "Additional Insureds" shown within 30 days of this agreement.
3. **Ownership:** USLA will register the boat and trailer and hold a New York State DMV title to each. TLVFD will show as the boat operator on the boat registration.
4. **Time of Use:** The Fire Boat will be used seasonally, namely between mid-May and Mid-October as weather and lake icing conditions permit.
5. **Transportation:** TLVFD will be responsible for all 'boat on trailer' movements including but not limited to spring launching, fall retrieving to and from a local winter storage facility and trips to repair and maintenance facilities as dictated by USLA. TLVFD will also be responsible for spring installation and fall removal of the Dock as stipulated in the agreement between TLVFD and Eagle Island, Inc.
6. **Maintenance:** TLVFD will notify USLA within 72 hours if the Fire Boat is inoperable, damaged or otherwise in need of significant repairs making it unusable for its intended purpose. USLA will be responsible for all repairs' once notified repairs are needed. USLA will also be responsible for annual Fire Boat and engine servicing expenses at no cost to TLVFD or the Village. Damage repair costs to the boat caused by inappropriate or reckless use of the boat will be the responsibility of the Village and TLVFD and/or its insurance carrier.
7. **Piloting:** Only TLVFD approved and trained staff will be allowed to operate the boat.
8. **Winterization and Storage:** During the off season, USLA will provide for a proper storage location in the local area at no cost to the Village or TLVFD. Summer storage of the empty Trailer will be the responsibility of USLA with TLVFD help transporting the trailer to a local location.

9. **Lease End Return:** In the event this Lease is terminated because the TLVFD/Town of Santa Clara agreement expires, the TLVFD will relinquish control of the Fire Boat, Trailer and Dock to USLA. At that time, the boat will be returned with all originally installed equipment, on its trailer in good operating condition less typical wear and tear of a boat of its age. The dock will be removed from the lake and placed on dry land as stipulated in the TLVFD/Eagle Island, Inc. agreement.
10. **Other Use:** On an exceptional occasion, USLA may request TLVFD to operate the boat for a non-emergency purpose at a mutually agreed upon time. (ex: July 4th parade)
11. **Indemnification and Hold Harmless:** During the term of this lease, Village and TLVFD agree, jointly and severally, to defend, protect, indemnify, and hold USLA and its agents, officers, directors, employees, volunteers and contractors harmless, against any and all claims, injuries (including death) of any persons (including but not limited to any Village and/or TLVFD personnel or volunteers), costs, expenses, liabilities, losses, damages (including but not limited to third party property damage, the Fire Boat, Trailer or Dock, and any damages to the environment or natural resources caused by any spillage of fuel or other contaminants), injunctions, suits, actions, judgements, fines, penalties, and demands of any kind or nature (including reasonable attorney's fees) arising out of Village's and TLVFD's negligence, willful misconduct or unlawful conduct in connection with the use of the Fire Boat, Trailer or Dock, or arising from the failure to comply with the obligations under this Agreement and Lease. It is expressly understood and agreed to by the Village and TLVFD that USLA shall not be responsible for damages to the Fire Boat, Trailer and Dock, or any other property (including Eagle Island, Inc. property), or injuries to persons (including but not limited to TLVFD personnel or volunteers) that may arise from, or be incident to the use of the Fire Boat, Trailer or Dock. The provisions and obligations contained in this section shall survive termination of this Agreement and Lease, but only as to claims arising out of actions, inactions or omissions that occur prior to such lease termination.
12. **Responsibility for TLVFD:** Village shall be responsible for the actions of the TLVFD during the term of this Agreement and Lease, to ensure compliance by TLVFD, and is obligated to cure any failure of the TLVFD to comply with the obligations of this Agreement and Lease.
13. **Docking Space:** Should the agreement between the Village/TLVFD and Eagle Island, Inc. terminate for any reason, the Village/TLVFD will work with USLA to find a new mutually agreed upon location to install the Dock and locate the Fire Boat.
14. **Compliance with Laws and Regulations:** Village and TLVFD shall ensure that activities related to the use of the Fire Boat, Trailer and Dock comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including but not limited to those set forth by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, The Adirondack Park Agency, and agencies that have authority over the Village's or TLVFD activities.

Without limiting the foregoing, Village and TLVFD shall ensure that Invasive Species Boat requirements have been complied with before launching the Fire Boat each spring and any time the Fire Boat is being returned to Upper Saranac Lake for docking.

15. **Governing Law:** This Agreement shall be interpreted and governed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York.
16. **Severability:** If any part of this Lease is found invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the Lease remains effective and binding.
17. **Notices:** All notices given in accordance with this Agreement and Lease shall be in writing to the address and attention as indicated below. Notice may be given by email, provided that the recipient of such email notice sends an email confirming receipt of such email notice. If no such email return receipt is received, the sending party must endeavor with due speed to contact the other party in person ASAP. Any party hereto may change to whom such notice is to be given by giving notice of such change in a manner set forth herein:

**AGREEMENT TO ALLOW TUPPER LAKE FIRE DEPARTMENT TO DOCK
FIRE BOAT AT EAGLE ISLAND LAUNCH**

This Agreement is entered into this 17th day of August, 2020, a Eagle Island, Inc., (Eagle Island), Village of Tupper Lake (Village), and Volunteer Tupper Lake Fire Department (Fire Department).

WHEREAS, Eagle Island owns property at 442 Gilpin Bay Road, Town of Santa Clara (Premises), which Premises fronts onto Upper Saranac Lake with a launch ramp and permanent 10' x 32' foot concrete dock. Eagle Island also owns a 30' x 4' open-grate seasonal walkway (Walkway) that can be installed along the shoreline in shallow water; and

WHEREAS, Village formed and operates the Fire Department which provides firefighting, rescue and other public safety functions; and

WHEREAS, the Village and Fire Department provide fire protection to a portion of the Town of Santa Clara that is closest to Tupper Lake and Saranac Lake, including properties on Upper Saranac Lake, while Paul Smiths provide fire protection to the other portions of Santa Clara; and

WHEREAS, the Upper Saranac Lake Association (Association) acquired a Fire Boat and Trailer, as well as a 32' x 4' seasonal dock to be utilized by the Fire Boat (Fire Boat Dock), and the Association transferred ownership of the Fire Boat to the Village (with a reversion clause if the Village and Fire Department no longer provide fire protection for Upper Saranac Lake) to maintain and use to provide fire protection for the homes in Santa Clara which are accessible by water or most directly by water; and

WHEREAS, consistent with such arrangement, the Fire Department utilizes the Fire Boat for firefighting, rescue and other public safety purposes, as well as for training exercises; and

WHEREAS, Village desires to dock the Fire Boat at location centrally located on Upper Saranac Lake, and requested that Eagle Island make arrangements to allow docking of the Fire Boat at Eagle Island's launch area at the Premises on a seasonal basis, from Mid-April through the end of October or Mid-November, ice out and ice in conditions in the Lake permitting; and

WHEREAS, Eagle Island agreed to such an arrangement, and took actions to obtain required approvals from the Town of Santa Clara (Town), and the Adirondack Park Agency (APA). More specifically, in May 2019, Eagle obtained a variance from the Town of Santa Clara to allow placement of the 30' x 4' open grate seasonal Walkway perpendicular to the existing concrete landing, and to install the FD's 32' x 4' seasonal dock perpendicular to the Walkway, so as to provide a dedicated slip for the Fire Boat. The Town issued a permit for the Walkway and Fire Boat Dock in June 2019. Eagle Island also obtained project approval permit from Adirondack Park Agency for the seasonal placement of the Walkway and Fire Boat Dock on June 28, 2019. The Santa Clara variance and APA permit approved the configuration as shown on the drawings dated April 7, 2019, and attached hereto as Exhibit A. Collectively, these approvals are referred to herein as Approvals; and

WHEREAS, following obtaining such Approvals, Eagle Island has permitted Village and Fire Department to commence utilizing the Premises for docking the Fire Boat in a manner consistent with such Approvals and this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties are desirous of entering into this Agreement to set forth and memorialize their understanding and agreement regarding the Fire Department use of the Premises for installation of the Fire Boat Dock and non-exclusive use of the Premises as set forth in this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

PERMISSION TO USE PREMISES. Eagle Island hereby grants to Village and Fire Department permission to use the Premises for the installation each spring of the Fire Boat Dock, the docking of the Fire Boat at the Fire Boat Dock (on the West Side of the Dock), and for the non-exclusive use of the Premises and launch area by the by Fire Department personnel, volunteers and other authorized by Village and Fire Department for firefighting, rescue and other public safety purposes, as well as for training exercises. This permission includes permission to store the Fire Boat Dock on the Premises when not in use, provided that such Dock is stored in a location directed by Eagle Island. The Fire Boat itself will not be stored on the Premises except when docked at the Fire Boat Dock.

INSTALLATION AND REMOVAL OF FIRE BOAT DOCK AND WALKWAY. Village and Fire Department are responsible for the installation and removal of the Fire Boat Dock and Walkway each spring and fall. Installation of the Fire Boat Dock and the Walkway shall be in strict compliance with the Approvals. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Eagle Island may elect any spring to install the Walkway, and, if desired, the Fire Boat Dock, before Fire Department is ready to move the Fire Boat to the Premises. Similarly, if in the fall Village and Fire Department remove the Fire Boat for the winter, Eagle Island may elect to have the Fire Boat Dock and/or Walkway remain in place, longer, in which case Eagle Island will be responsible for removal.

NOTICE TO EAGLE ISLAND BEFORE NON-EMERGENCY USE. For installing and removing the Fire Boat Dock and the Walkway, and for training and other non-emergency use, Fire Department shall provide notice to Eagle Island notice 24 hours in advance in order to coordinate with Eagle Island's use of the launch and dock area.

LOCATION OF THE FIRE BOAT. The Fire Boat shall be docked on the westside of Fire Boat Dock.

GATE TO LAUNCH. Eagle Island will provide the Fire Department with a key to or the combination of (as the case may be) the lock on the gate that allows access to the launch area. Except in an emergency situation, if the gate is locked when Fire Department personnel arrive at the Premises, they shall lock the gate after entry. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event that, for any reason, Fire Department must break the lock, chain or gate, Fire Department responsible for repair or replacement of the lock, chain or gate.

PARKING. Fire Department personal and volunteers are permitted to utilize the vehicle parking area on the Premises in connection with use, including maintenance and repair, of the Fire Boat, provided that, in non-emergency situations, Fire Department shall give Eagle Island advance notice of the times such use will be made, and shall coordinate parking with Eagle Island so as not to interfere with Eagle Island's operations and use of the parking area. Vehicles utilizing the parking area shall be at the owners risk and Eagle Island shall not be responsible for any damage to such vehicles or items left in such vehicles.

NO ALTERATIONS TO FIRE BOAT DOCK AND WALKWAY CONFIGURATION. Village or Fire Department shall not make any alteration of the Fire Boat Dock or the Walkway, nor cause them to be installed in a configuration other than for which the Approvals were obtained without first obtaining any and all

required approvals from the Town of Santa Clara, the APA and any other agency or body have jurisdiction thereof, which approvals shall be obtained at no expense to Eagle Island, and which modifications shall first be agreed to by Eagle Island.

INSURANCE. During the term of the Agreement, Village and Fire Department shall procure and maintain at their expense and without expense to Eagle Island, Commercial General Liability insurance, with a minimum \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000/aggregate coverage. Such insurance shall be written by an insurance company authorized to write insurance in the State of New York, shall be drawn on standard forms approved by the New York State Insurance Department and shall protect as listed "Additional Insureds": Eagle Island and its agents, officers, directors, employees, volunteers and all contractors, consultants, and subcontractors to the aforementioned parties. All insurance required to be maintained under this Agreement must be provide that the applicable coverage must not be cancelled without thirty (30) days notice to the insureds, including Eagle Island. Village and Fire Department shall provide Eagle Island with a copy of the endorsement with the required Additional Insureds shown.

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS. Village and Fire Department agree, jointly and severally, to defend, protect, indemnify, and hold Eagle Island and Eagle Island's agents, officers, directors, employees, and contractors harmless against and from any and all claims, injuries (including death) of any persons (including but not limited to any Fire Department personnel or volunteers), costs, expenses, liabilities, losses, damages (including but not limited to the Premises and improvements thereto, and any damages to the environment or natural resources caused by any spillage of fuel or other contaminants), injunctions, suits, actions, judgments, fines, penalties, and demands of any kind or nature (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of Village's and Fire Department's negligence, willful misconduct or unlawful conduct in connection with its use of the Premises, or arising from any failure to comply with the obligations under this Agreement. It is expressly understood and agreed to by Village and Fire Department that Eagle Island shall not be responsible for damages to the Fire Boat, or any other property or injuries to persons (including but not limited to Fire Department personnel or volunteers) that may arise from, or be incident to the use of the Premises by Village or Fire Department. The provisions and obligations contained in this section shall survive termination of this Agreement, but only as to claims arising out of action, inactions or omissions that occur prior to such termination.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR Fire Department. Village shall be responsible for the actions of Fire Department during the Term of this Agreement, to ensure compliance by Fire Department, and is obligated to cure any failure of Fire Department to comply the obligations of this Agreement.

TERM. The use currently being made of the Premises by Village and Fire Department shall continue under this Agreement. The term of this Agreement shall be from January 1 to December 31 of each year, and shall renew automatically unless either party gives the other party notice of non-renewal on or before December 1 of the expiring year.

TERMINATION. Village may terminate this Agreement on 30 days notice; however, if Fire Boat Dock has been installed, Village and Fire Department will not remove the Fire Boat Dock until the end of the season, unless such Fire Boat Dock is needed by the Fire Department for the Fire Boat at a different location. Eagle Island may terminate this Agreement for cause if Village or Fire Department violate any of the terms and conditions on 14 days' notice, unless such violations is incurred to the satisfaction of Eagle Island within 10 days of such notice. Upon termination or cancellation of this lease, the Fire Dock must be removed

from the Premises and Premises restored to its original condition unless otherwise stated in a separate written instrument executed by the Lessor and Lessee.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS. Village and Fire Department shall ensure that activities at the Premises comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including but not limited to those set forth by the New York Department of Environmental Conservation, the Adirondack Park Agency, and agencies have authority over the Premises and/or Village's or Fire Department's activities. Without limiting the foregoing, Village and Fire Department shall ensure that the Invasive Species Clean Boat requirements have been complied with before launching the Fire Boat each spring and any time the Fire Boat is being returned to Upper Saranac Lake for docking.

NOTICES. All notices given in accordance with this Agreement shall be in writing to the address and attention as indicated below. Notice may be given by email, provided that the recipient of such email notice sends an email confirming receipt of such email. If no such confirming email is received, written notice must be given by certified mail (return receipt requested) by personal delivery, or by a nationally recognized overnight delivery service. Any party hereto may change to whom such notice is to be given by giving notice of such change in the manner set forth herein:

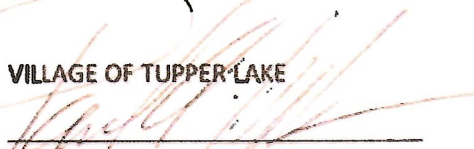

Memorandum of Understanding

The Upper Saranac Lake Association (USLA) is donating a Harbor Guard Firehawk 24 Fire Boat (the boat) and a removable 40-foot dock (the dock) to the Tupper Lake Volunteer Fire Department (TLVFD) and the TLVFD is accepting the donation with the following understanding:

1. The boat and dock will be the property of the TLVFD.
2. The boat and dock will be maintained, stored and operated by the TLVFD.
3. The boat will be docked and used primarily for fire and rescue on Upper Saranac Lake.
4. The USLA acknowledges that the TLVFD may from time to time use the boat for emergency response at other locations and then return the boat to Upper Saranac lake as soon as practicable.
5. In the event the TLVFD chooses to discontinue, or is unable to continue operating the boat for the benefit of the Upper Saranac Lake community, the TLVFD will relinquish ownership and donate the boat back to the USLA.

WHEREAS, the Village understands that they will be required to cover the 50% local-government share up to the maximum grant amount of \$50,000 and 100% of all project cost beyond the maximum grant if the project does not move forward to implementation, and 10% of the \$50,00 grant if the project does proceed to implementation, as required by the Grant.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it RESOLVED, that the Village does hereby request that the Development Authority of the North Country (DANC) provide a proposal to complete a study to quantify the potential benefits of consolidation and educate Village residents about the results of the study.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it RESOLVED, that the Village does hereby authorize Village Mayor, Mary Fontana, to execute all financial and /or administrative processes relating to the implementation of the program on behalf of the Village as lead applicant for a Local Government CREG grant application.

This AMENDMENT made the _____ day of May, 2026, by and between Village of Tupper Lake, (hereinafter called CLIENT), and WRIGHT-PIERCE ENGINEERING CONSULTANTS P.C. (hereinafter called ENGINEER).

WHEREAS, an Agreement was entered on August 19th, 2024 between the CLIENT and ENGINEER, which Agreement is entitled Drinking Water Supply Project (hereinafter referred to as AGREEMENT).

WHEREAS,

The Client has requested that Engineer perform an evaluation of the sewer collection and wastewater treatment plant's capacity to receive and treated estimated waste flows as described in the "Pitchfork Pond Pilot Testing Report" dated April 3rd, 2026 by Wright-Pierce.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of said AGREEMENT and other good and valuable considerations, it is hereby agreed and acknowledged by and between CLIENT and ENGINEER to amend the AGREEMENT as follows:

1. The AGREEMENT shall be amended to include this AMENDMENT, a copy of which shall be attached thereto and made a part thereof.
2. The scope shall include:
 - a. Assessment of the sewer collection system's capacity to receive and convey the estimated waste flows as described in the Pitchfork Pond pilot report testing report and as described in the attached proposal letter dated May 15, 2026.
 - b. Assessment of the ability of the Village's existing wastewater treatment plant to accept the waste flows and loads from the proposed water treatment plant as described in the Pitchfork Pond pilot testing report and as described in the attached proposal.
 - c. The results of the assessments will be summarized in a memorandum to be signed by Wright-Pierce and submitted to New York State Department of Health.
 - d. Update of cost for recommended sewer improvement number 1 from as described in the attached proposal. DANC will use cost estimate to prepare an engineering planning grant application for development of a preliminary engineering report for future sewer collection improvements.

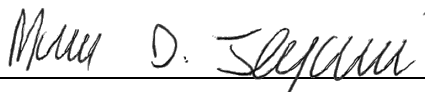
3. The fee shall be increased from \$246,500 to \$276,500 for the services described herein.

As requested, Wright-Pierce is pleased to submit a budgetary scope and fee proposal to the Village for assessment of the sewer collection system and WWTP capacity to receive the estimated waste flows from the proposed Pitchfork Pond water treatment plant as described in the "Pitchfork Pond Pilot Testing Report" dated April 3rd, 2026.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

In 2025 the Village contracted Wright-Pierce to pilot iron and manganese treatment for the Pitchfork Pond wells and produce a report with conceptual design information based on pilot results. The "Pitchfork Pond Pilot Testing Report" dated April 3rd, 2026 was submitted to the Village and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) for review and approval to proceed to final design. The report conceptually sized an 800 gpm iron and manganese removal water treatment plant to treat Well 1 and Well 2, the Pitchfork Pond wells. Based on comments from NYSDOH dated April 17, 2026 and a meeting held between the Village, NYSDOH, DANC, Hydrosourc, and Wright-Pierce on April 29th, 2026, the ability of the Village's existing sewer collection system and wastewater treatment plant to accept and treat the estimated waste flows from the proposed water treatment plant will need to be assessed. NYSDOH has requested a memorandum summarizing the assessment by the first week in August 2026 to remain on project schedule.

The Village and Town have previously undertaken studies and improvement projects within the sewer collection and wastewater treatment system. The Village provided Wright-Pierce with the following previous reports and information:

- "Preliminary Engineering Report for Wastewater Treatment Plant and Collection System Improvements" dated August 2016 by C2AE.
- "Infiltration/Inflow Study Sanitary Sewer Improvements" dated 3/1/2019 by C2AE
- "Town of Tupper Lake Sewer District No 1 Infrastructure Improvements" dated March 28, 2025
- Monthly operating reports (MORs) for wastewater treatment facility- January 2023 to December 2025

A discussion was also held between Wright Pierce and the Village's chief water and wastewater operator on May 6th, 2026 regarding the content of reports and improvements executed. It was determined that, since 2016,

the WWTP has been upgraded, a 24 inch collection main was installed between PS#3 and the WWTP, and limited other improvements have been made by the Village. The Town is also proposing to make improvements to Sewer District 1 and has been listed on the 2026 CWSRF IUP. The number 1 and 2 recommended improvements from the 2019 I/I improvements report have not been made and the system still experiences significant I/I issues, which are mitigated by the permitted SSO. Review of the MORs indicates that in 2025 the Village did not exceed their permitted capacity at the WWTP, but in 2024 they did exceed with a max flow of 4.59 MGD following a significant rain event. Not exceeding the permitted capacity in 2025 is attributed to a combination of factors, but not to a reduction in overall I/I in the system between 2024 and 2025 since no significant I/I reduction projects had been undertaken.

LIMITATIONS AND ASSUMPTIONS

No flow monitoring data is available from the collection system in the areas where the WTP waste is anticipated to flow in collection.

No manhole rim or invert elevation data for sewer collection manholes is available.

NYSDOH would like a letter confirming capacity is available by August 2026, which limits the time available to obtain the missing information.

The Village needs to move forward with design and construction of the WTP due to NYSDOH and EPA violation orders.

Based on the understanding that the Village has recently violated their permitted capacity at the WWTP and that no significant improvements have been made in the collection system since that time to reduce I/I, it is unlikely at this time, without additional evaluation, that we will be able to clearly state that the collection system and WWTP currently have additional capacity to accept flows from the new WTP.

Given the information gaps and the limited amount of time in which to gather data, especially seasonal flow data, we propose that a limited assessment be carried out with future I/I improvement assumptions made and follow up actions proposed to satisfy NYSDOH that sewer collection and treatment capacity will be available near completion of WTP construction. Additional data validation may also be necessary following the study to verify assumptions.

SCOPE

Task 1- Kick Off Meeting and Data Review

Wright-Pierce will prepare for, host, and attend one kickoff meeting with the Village and DANC via Microsoft Teams. Available information provided by the Village will be reviewed prior to the kick off meeting. The intent of the meeting is to discuss the scope, schedule, and deliverables, findings of previous I/I reporting, improvement projects that have been completed since development of previous reports, historical flows, WWTP treatment violations or difficulties, and to finalize the action items required to complete this assessment. WP will prepare and submit requests for information (RFI's) to the Village as needed to obtain the necessary information to complete the assessment.

Task 2- Sewer Capacity Assessment

The currently proposed location of the WTP is off of Kildare Road, just outside the Village. Based on review of the provided information, the wastewater discharge from the proposed WTP is anticipated to flow along Kildare, 9th Street, Main Street, Underwood Road, Berkley Avenue, Arthur Street, cross country to Pine Street, cross country to Water Street, and then to the WWTP. To evaluate whether this portion of the collection system has capacity to convey anticipated waste flows from the WTP along with residential flows, we will model the sewer collection system along this route using an excel based spreadsheet.

Sanitary sewer flows from side streets connecting to the gravity mains along the route will be estimated based on property information and counting of connected lots. The connected lot count and their properties will be based on publicly available parcel data available through DANC's GIS system. The model will be based on a collection system in which I/I repairs have been made and it will be assumed that no I/I is present along side streets or the main route.

The main locations, lengths, and diameters will be taken from the plans provided from previous reports provided by the Village. Elevations of the rims and upstream and down-stream inverts of the manholes along this route will be necessary. We will use publicly available LIDAR information to estimate the elevation of manhole rims due to the restriction in time. LIDAR data is not survey-grade and conclusions drawn from LIDAR data may need to be revised following this assessment. Currently accuracy of LIDAR information is believed to be approximately 6 inches +/- but may vary across the project area or need to be estimated due to cover. **The Village will be asked to provide invert information as measured from the rim to the bottom of the inverts for roughly 28 manholes along the route. It is anticipated that this information will need to be provided from measurements taken in the field by the operators.**

Flow monitoring to verify results with I/I or survey grade information may be required by NYSDOH or NYSDEC following this assessment.

Task 3- WWTP Capacity Assessment

Wright-Pierce will perform an assessment of the WWTP's ability to receive and treat the anticipated additional waste flow from the proposed water treatment. Assessment is anticipated to consist of:

- o Make one site visit to view the WWTP and the collection system route from the proposed WTP with the operator.
- o Review latest available version of the WWTP SPDES permit and confirm current and anticipated effluent discharge permit requirements with operator. Village to provide permit.
- o Review, tabulate and evaluate the existing treatment plant influent flows and loads based on historic monthly operating reports for the past three (3) years. Village will provide three years of monthly operating reports in electronic PDF or Excel format.
- o Assess whether total anticipated flows from collection including WTP waste flows, with I/I issues addressed in the gravity collection system as previously noted, will remain below permitted flow

limits. Village will provide flow data for the last three years from all wastewater pump stations in the system and at WWTP in PDF or Excel format.

- o Based on a general understanding of the capability of the treatment process, experience with the type of treatment, historic flows and loading, and anticipated waste content from the proposed WTP, assess the WWTP's ability to treat the anticipated amount and content of the proposed WTP wastes. Identify operational performance and/or permit compliance issues that may impact the ability to receive proposed WTP waste flows and loads and discuss with WWTP staff currently planned improvements to potentially resolve these issues so they can be noted in memorandum.
- o Develop a brief technical memorandum summarizing the results of the sewer collection and WWTP assessment for submission to NYSDOH with the intent of receiving authorization to proceed with design of the proposed WTP.

Task 4- Engineering Planning Grant Application Cost Updates

Our assessment is anticipated to be contingent on a reduction of I/I in the future. NYSDOH and NYSDEC may require that the Village plan to do a sewer collection system project to reduce I/I in the future before allowing design or construction of the WTP to move forward.

The NYSEFC Engineering Planning Grant (EPG) applications are open and are able to provide grant funding to develop a preliminary engineering report to support an application to CWSRF for projects based on results of a previous I/I report.

Under this task Wright-Pierce will update the cost from the 2019 report for the #1 priority project identified in the 2019 I/I report, which is sewer replacement in sections along Main Street, Underwood Road, and Palmer Ave. This improvement was anticipated to result in a reduction of 75,000 gpd in I/I at the time of the report creation. The cost will be updated for inflation using the ENR index and bidding data that Wright-Pierce has received within approximately one previous year. DANC will use the cost to assist the Village with development and submission of an application for an EPG. This application is intended to demonstrate the Village's effort towards addressing I/I.

BUDGETARY FEE

For the proposed scope of services, we propose a not-to-exceed fee of \$30,000, including expenses, which has been broken out in the table below.
